

CREATION CORNER CONSERVATION?

I have just finished looking over a magazine someone sent me because they know I love nature. At first I was happy to see it but I soon laid it down with grief.

Conservation, says Webster, is “preserving, guarding, protecting; keeping in a safe or entire state; preservation.

This magazine talks about “conservation.” So far, so good. But they only want to conserve living creatures so they can go out and kill them for sport. That is bad.

What people have destroyed in the past by depraved human nature must now be conserved, preserved, built up, restored. Why? To undo the wrong done to creation? No! To provide more birds and animals for more murder. The whole vicious circle is summed up in the one word at the bottom of the front cover—“Sport.” It shows a picture of a beautiful dog sitting in a woodsy spot holding in its mouth a once-beautiful dead bird.

REBUKE THE DEVOURER

In 1896, a plague of grasshoppers hit Minnesota and Mrs. Lois Calkins tells this story of God's promised blessings. In early autumn clouds of grasshoppers had swept down in the area and laid their eggs in the soil in great amounts. A bounty of so much for each bushel of insects was offered and many bushels of them were destroyed, but it seemed a hopeless battle and prospects for the next year were very dark.

She continues: "My father was an old man in very feeble health; mother was not strong, and I had two little brothers. My health was also very poor, and our income was small. Still, we were not discouraged; we studied the Bible, and believed that the promises of God are the same to us in these last days as they were to His people in olden times, and we laid the matter before Him. We told Him how we were situated, and asked Him to bless us in planting a garden, and to protect it from the grasshoppers; and we believed He would do it.

"In the spring, when the grasshoppers hatched out, they covered a large portion of our small garden spot. To all outward appearances it would be useless to plant a garden there. How-ever, we had the ground prepared, and planted our garden, trusting in the Lord to protect it from the grasshoppers.

"When the seeds came up, there were no grasshoppers in our garden, and the vegetables grew rapidly. When the grasshoppers were full grown, in the time of day when they hopped and

flew, it sounded like the fast falling of hail all around and over the garden and in the time of day when they were quiet, they were in great heaps around the garden.

"When I went into the garden, and saw everything growing so well, exceeding everything I had ever seen or heard of, and the grasshoppers so very thick around it, and knew that everything else was destroyed for many miles around by them, it seemed almost like holy ground. I could not but think what a kind heavenly Father we have, and how unworthy we are of His favour.

"The small garden yielded beyond all expectations; fifty bushel of beets from a small patch, eighty-three very large squashes from three vines. It seemed to us that the ground had surely brought forth its increase. People came for miles to buy of us; and though our garden was but small, we were able to sell considerable produce, gave some to neighbours, and had our cellar well filled. When people came to buy of us, they wondered at the abundant yield, in the midst of the grasshoppers. Even those who were not Christians, when they saw our garden, would exclaim, 'How you are blessed!'

"We had just begun to pay tithe, having but recently heard of the tithing system, and had not noticed what the Lord says: 'Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in Mine house, and prove Me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. TRUE-STORY-TIME

'DOWSING'

There is a very interesting type of witchcraft that you need to know about. Why? Well, because a lot of Christian people are doing it and they think it is something natural, but it is really sorcery! It has many names and it is used in many ways, but once you learn about it, you can always spot it.

We will start by looking at the main kind of it, which is called 'dowsing', or 'water witching'. When somebody wants to dig a well, especially in areas where water is scarce and hard to find, they send for someone called a 'dowser'.

Now these people usually 'learned' dowsing from a parent and people think the 'talent' is

inherited. The dowser comes and brings some kind of a 'dowsing rod', which is often a Y shaped stick. They will hold the two sides of the Y and point the bottom part in front of them and walk around the property where the well is to be made.

When they come to a place where water can be found, the stick will drop down hard pointing to the ground. There are different kinds of 'dowsing rods'; some dowsers will balance a straight stick on their fingers and it will spin around to indicate water. Others will bend a stick like a bow and it will snap back against them when the water is found.

By now, you are probably asking, "How does a stick manage to move?" I am glad you asked that question, because sticks can't move unless someone or Something moves them! But these people who do this 'water witching' don't often stop and think about it. They think that they have some kind of special 'gift' to be able to do this or they think it is just a 'natural' thing. Some think it comes from God, others are not so sure, but most won't believe you when you tell them it is one of Satan's angels that make that dowsing rod work.

"But", you may ask, "Why would Satan help people find water?" Satan can do good deeds if he wants to, but he always does it for an evil purpose. If Satan does you a favour, sooner or later he will want something in return, and what he really wants is to destroy you!

People who learn this 'dowsing' from a relative often see no harm in it, but often in their life they will start with this and later go on to more and more spiritualist practices, and all the way they fool themselves that it is just a special gift they have or it is 'natural'. One of the things that happens when people get involved with spiritualism is they don't want to admit the devil is involved with it and they should repent of it and stop! They will come out with all kinds of silly reasons why it is fine because it makes them feel proud to have this 'special gift'.

One of the more advanced ways people use this kind of sorcery is by having a small weight on the end of a string or chain called a pendulum. Sometimes people look for water using this thing and the weight will spin when over the water. Sometimes they look for gold, silver or other metals. Sometimes people use it in figuring out diseases and whether or not a certain food is good to eat, and sometimes they ask it questions!

Here is the real weird part; sometimes they use

a map or a drawing of the area where they want to look for water or whatever they want, and they hang their pendulum over the Map! Then when the pendulum spins over a spot on the map, they mark that spot and that is where they will dig for what they want.

Now, even if there might possibly be some natural energy that could attract a stick or a pendulum to water, it certainly would not be present in the Map! But some people do this sort of thing; some of them do it with maps sent to them from other countries.

Dear readers, I want to tell you that wherever you see any kind of dowsing or pendulums, or hear people talk about 'energy fields' or 'special gifts', get away from it and have nothing to do with it! It is one of Satan's snares, no matter how 'good' you may think the person is who does it, and some ministers even do this stuff! Shame on them!

It always leads to a gradual or not so gradual, leaving behind of real Bible truth and often leads all the way to devil possession. It is just another kind of Ouija board and it is the demon angels that are giving the answer.

How do we know it isn't God? Because God condemns 'divination' in the Bible and that is the old name for dowsing. How do you find water when you need to? You humbly go to God in prayer and pray earnestly and as He has promised— 'Ask and it shall be given to you.' God's people don't need the devil's 'gifts'! = ^ .. ^ =

STORY LESSON

OUR BONES

You will remember that the bones are the framework of the body, just like the 2 X 4s in a house are called its frame. All the bones together make up the skeleton. There are about two hundred bones in all. They are many different shapes and sizes from the tiny bones of your ear, which are smallest, to the upper bone of your leg, which is the largest. The skeleton is divided into four parts: the skull, the trunk, the arms, and the legs.

The skull is something like a shell. It is made of a number of bones joined together to leave a hollow place inside to hold the brain. The front part of the skull forms the framework of the face and the jaws. In each ear there are three tiny little bones, which help us hear.

The bones of the trunk are, the ribs, the breastbone, the pelvis, and the back-bone or spine. The bones of the trunk form a framework to

support and protect the various organs in its cavities.

There are twelve ribs on each side. The ribs join the backbone at the back and are connected by cartilage to the breast-bone in front. With the breastbone and the backbone they make a bony cage to hold and protect the heart and the lungs.

The pelvis is at the lower part of the trunk. It is formed by three bones closely joined together. The large bones at either side are the hipbones. Each hipbone contains a deep round cavity where the upper end of the thighbone rests.

The backbone, or spinal column, is made of twenty-four small bones, joined together in such a way that it can bend in many directions. The skull is on the upper end of the spinal column. The lower end of the backbone is part of the pelvis.

Each of the separate bones that make up the backbone has an open center, and the bones arranged, one above another make a sort of canal in the backbone. This canal opens into the cavity of the skull. Through it passes a cable of nerves called the spinal cord.

Each of the arms has five bones, besides the small bones of the hand. They are the collarbone, which connects the shoulder to the breastbone, the shoulder blade, at the back of the shoulders, the upper arm bone, between the shoulder and the elbow, and the two lower arm bones, between the elbow and wrist. There are eight little bones in the wrist, five in the hand next to the wrist, and fourteen in the fingers and thumb.

The bones of the leg are the thigh or upper leg bone, the kneecap, which covers the front of the knee, the two bones of the lower leg, the heel bone and six other bones in the ankle, five bones next to the ankle, and fourteen bones in the toes.

The skeleton is not only needed as a framework for the body, but it is useful in other ways. Some of the bones, like the skull, protect delicate parts. The brain is so soft and delicate that it needs its solid bony covering. The spinal cord also needs the protection of the strong but flexible backbone. The bones help to move our hands and arms, and assist us in walking.

The places where two or more bones are fastened together are called joints. Some joints we can move very freely, like the shoulder and the hip. Others have no motion at all, like the bones of the skull.

The ends of bones that come together to form a joint are covered with a smooth, tough substance,

which protects the bone from wear. This is called gristle or cartilage.

The joint contains a fluid to oil it, so that the ends of bones move very easily. If the joints were dry, every movement of the body would be very difficult and painful.

The bones are held together at the joints by means of strong bands called ligaments.

Bones are not so solid as they seem to be. The outside of most bones is much harder than the inside. Long bones, like the arms and legs, are hollow. The hollow space is filled with marrow, in which are blood vessels to nourish the bone.

It is calcium and other minerals that makes the bones hard and firm so they do not bend by the weight of the body. When we get old, our bones start losing these minerals, and become more brittle, and can break more easily. One of the good things about a whole food plant diet is that in old age, bones lose their calcium much more slowly than heavy meat eaters' bones. = ^ .. ^ =

WEEKLY BIBLE LESSON 13:
"YOUR WONDERFUL FUTURE"

For our Bible lessons we are going to use the King James Version of the Bible. Just like the boys and girls used to use to learn to read from in the pioneer days.

There will be some texts to look up for each day and you should practice your memory verse until you can say it without looking. Don't forget to learn the text too.

MEMORY VERSE: "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away." Revelation 21:4.

Sunday

Text: Revelation 19:1,2 "And after these things I heard a great voice of much people in heaven, saying, Alleluia; Salvation, and glory, and honour, and power, unto the Lord our God: For true and righteous are his judgments: for he hath judged the great whore, which did corrupt the earth with her fornication, and hath avenged the blood of his servants at her hand."

Chapter 19 tells us about how Jesus will fight for His people, and the cruel, corrupt powers that torture and kill, will come to an end forever! This is really the story of Jesus coming for to rescue His bride and receiving His kingdom.

Verse after verse tell of the joy of the redeemed ones in all the different groups; how they all agree that the Lord God is so wonderful and they are so happy that He is reigning.

Monday

Text: Revelation 20:1 “And I saw an angel come down from heaven, having the key of the bottomless pit and a great chain in his hand. And he laid hold on the dragon, that old serpent, which is the Devil, and Satan, and bound him a thousand years.”

This shows us what is going to happen after Jesus comes and gathers His dear children off this earth. It talks about Satan getting tied up with a great chain. Remember these picture stories are full of symbols. You could not tie up a spirit being with a real chain. It says he is cast into a 'bottomless pit', which means a place that is empty and deserted.

3 "And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God."

The most wonderful thing about Heaven is that Jesus is there with us forever! When you were little, do you remember that the happiest times for you would be when your Mom or Daddy would come and play with you and spend time with you? You might have lots of toys and things to do, but nothing was as much fun as when Mom or Dad did it with you.

It will be like that in Heaven; everything will be so much more wonderful and fun because Jesus will be with us doing things with us. He will answer all our questions and teach us wonderful things that we can't even imagine now.

4 "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away."

After the wicked are all destroyed, along with the devil and his nasty angels, all suffering and pain and death and fear will be gone from the whole universe. And it will never come back any more!

5 "And he that sat upon the throne said, Behold, I make all things new. And he said unto me, Write: for these words are true and faithful."

The Holy City will come down to earth and after the fires purify the earth, Jesus, our Creator, will make it all new for us. We will be able to watch it happen! Then, what a celebration of joy and peace will come on that first Sabbath in the new earth! What music! What beauty! What wonderful friends we will have!

You will have animals and birds to enjoy, and you will be able to run and never get tired and also to fly! You will be able to travel through space and see things we can't even imagine. You will travel with Jesus and angels and get to meet the people in other planets, who have been watching the sad history of this sin sick world and are so happy to see people redeemed from it. They will all be your friends.

Thought - Do you know that the people in other planets will want to hear about how Jesus saved you? Yes; this will be the wonderful story we will tell over and over again.

Thursday

Text: Revelation 21:24-26 "And the nations of them which are saved shall walk in the light of it: and the kings of the earth do bring their glory and honour into it. And the gates of it shall not be shut at all by day: for there shall be no night"

there. And they shall bring the glory and honour of the nations into it."

Did you know that everything that is good and wonderful on this earth will be found in heaven? Yes, indeed! All the wonderful heroes of the faith will be there, and all the kind and noble people will be there. Everything that is right and good to do, will be also done in heaven.

There are so many funny ideas about what heaven is like, that some children have thought they would not want to go to such a place. They have been told that all you do is sit around on a cloud and play a harp all day. Or some have thought that everybody just sits around on hard chairs and looks very solemn and you have to be quiet.

But this is not true at all; heaven will be the happiest place that you can ever imagine! But there would be people who would not want to go to heaven, because the only things they like to do are sad, bad things and things that are harmful and wicked. Unless they allow Jesus to give them a new heart that loves the kind of things God loves, they would not be happy in heaven. That is why they will not be there.

27 "And there shall in no wise enter into it any thing that defileth, neither whatsoever worketh abomination, or maketh a lie: but they which are written in the Lamb's book of life."

If a person wants to smoke dirty cigarettes or drink harmful alcohol or take drugs that hurt his body and brain; if he wants to do things that hurt or destroy other people or animals, they can never be allowed in heaven. They would be miserable there and they would also ruin the place.

Some people, if they were there, the first thing they would try to do is make rules to spoil everyone's happiness; and then they would make a plan to keep all the gold and jewels just for themselves and not share with others. First thing you know they would make people have to pay to have fruit from the Tree of Life, and guards would be placed around the River of Life, and only certain people could go there.

This will not ever happen; heaven is a place of joy and freedom such as us poor creatures down here cannot even imagine! Never again will fear or oppression raise its ugly head.

Thought - As the years of eternity roll, we will have more and more joy and happiness and as we learn more and more about our kind Heavenly Father and our Saviour, we will have more and more Love. 'Tis love that makes us happy'.

Friday

Text: Revelation 22:6,7 "And he said unto me, These sayings are faithful and true: and the Lord God of the holy prophets sent his angel to shew unto his servants the things which must shortly be done. Behold, I come quickly: blessed is he that keepeth the sayings of the prophecy of this book."

Here Jesus is telling us, "This is for real; it is true; and it is soon going to happen!" He then says those who 'keep the things in the book' are blessed. What does that mean? Well, it is telling us if we learn about the things this book tells us and we give our whole hearts to Jesus and let Him help us to live His kind of life, we will be very glad and happy. And someday, very soon, He will come and take us home.

Oh, I see some children interested in things that are only traps of Satan; they have TV programs or cartoons and videos and video or computer games and they think they are so important. Or they are all caught up with baseball, or football, or soccer, or hockey, or basketball and they think it is the most important thing in the whole world.

But it isn't at all! The most important thing in the whole world is to live like Jesus, with Him in your heart, and be every day getting ready for heaven!

8-9 "And I John saw these things, and heard them. And when I had heard and seen, I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel which shewed me these things. Then saith he unto me, See thou do it not: for I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren the prophets, and of them which keep the sayings of this book: worship God."

Here John gets excited again because of the wonderful things he is seeing and forgets and tries to worship the angel again, but he patiently reminds him, "Worship God."

This is very good advice; when we really worship God, we think about Him, we admire Him, we love to talk about Him, our whole life aims towards Him; Then we will be truly happy.

14 "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city. 15 For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and murderers, and idolaters, and whosoever loveth and maketh a lie."

Who are going to be in heaven? Those who obey

God. Who are going to be left out?

'Dogs'; This isn't bow-wow doggies, no, it means cruel and heartless, wicked people.

'Sorcerers'; Have you noticed a lot of people into magic and witches and wizards these days? Well, they must repent and leave those things or never see heaven!

'Whoremongers and murderers'; This means sexually impure people and those who kill and are cruel to others.

'Idolaters'; people who love something better than they love Jesus and His ways.

Those who 'Love and Make lies'; this is a very serious one, it includes people who like to pretend

things are true that are not true, and people who like to read or see fiction stories. It includes people who write or make fiction stories or movies. It also includes being dishonest in any way, and those who refuse to believe the Bible because they would rather have things some other way. The only safety is always love what is true!

Thought – I would invite all who read this, to look around in your life and if you find any things, (games, stories, books, TV, Movies) that are not true, get them out of your life! Then replace them with God's Word and true things. I can tell you from my own experience, you will be soooo happy you did!
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
